PERMANENT BASE ADJUSTMENT

A Permanent Base Adjustment is an adjustment to the maximum amount of money the Town would otherwise be allowed to spend under state law. It does not increase taxes or allow the Town to spend more money than it has, it simply asks voters to allow the Town to spend the money it collects on needed services and infrastructure projects.

Proposition 434, a Proposition asking the voters to approve a \$3,000,000 Permanent Adjustment to the original base expenditure limit will be on the August 30, 2016 ballot.

If approved, the new 1979/80 base limit would be \$3,255,616 and that number would then be used to calculate the annual expenditure limitation by multiplying with the applicable population factor and inflation factor. The projected state imposed expenditure limitation of \$3,000,000, as calculated annually by the State, will allow the Town of Clarkdale to set annual budgets based upon revenues collected throughout the next decade.

DROUGHT & WATER SHORTAGE PREPAREDNESS PLAN

Under the Town of Clarkdale's water ordinance, Drought and Water Shortage Preparedness Strategy Level I is automatically in effect from May 1st through September 30th each year. With that in mind, effective May 1, 2016 @ 12:01 a.m., The Town of Clarkdale will move into Demand Reduction Strategy I "Water Alert". **The following measures will be mandatory starting:**

- Water shall be conserved both inside and outside the home using best practices available to minimize waste.
- Landscaping for residential uses shall be accomplished with plant materials that require little or no supplemental irrigation water.
- Outdoor water usage shall not occur between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm. Watering days shall be coordinated with your address. Even numbered addresses may irrigate on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. Odd numbered addresses may irrigate on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. For places where there is no discernable address, the even date schedule should be followed (right-of-ways, medians, etc.). No irrigation shall be allowed on Monday.
- Automobile washing shall only be undertaken with a bucket and hose with shut off nozzle, other water saving devices such as a pressure washer, or at carwashes that recycle or re-circulate water.
- No person shall waste water.
- Cooling of outdoor areas with water or misting devices is prohibited.
- Restaurants shall serve water to customers upon request only, and shall display table tents or other types of public notice to this affect.
- Hotels shall wash a customer's linens if a stay is in excess of one night on request only, and the hotel shall display notice to this affect.
- Construction projects are required to use reclaimed water or effluent for construction and dust control purposes.
- Requests for Commercial Provisions must be made to the Clarkdale Utilities Director.

All Demand Reduction Strategies of the Plan are enforced by the Town of Clarkdale Utilities Department. Violations of this Plan shall result in the following surcharges:

1. A surcharge of \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) shall be assessed to the account of record for a violation of **Demand Reduction Strategy I "Water Alert"**, pursuant to Town Code Section 19-11-7.
2. Surcharges shall double for every repeat violation that occurs within a calendar year.

Updates to Resource Status Levels and Demand Reduction Strategies will be posted on the Town's website: www.clarkdale.az.gov. Signage is also in place throughout the Town providing notice of the prevailing Demand Reduction Strategy Level (Strategy I = "Water Alert"; Strategy II = "Water Emergency"; Strategy III = "Water Crisis").



SR89A FOCUS AREA PLAN

Time is running out to comment on the SR89A Focus Area Plan. The Planning Commission began reviewing the final draft of this master development plan in April, and will consider making a recommendation in May to move the plan forward to Town Council for review and approval.

The objective of the plan is to encourage sustainable, attractive, productive development along the commercial corridor between Clarkdale and Cottonwood. The draft plan identifies challenges and opportunities for future development along the highway corridor. Comments from previous public meetings have been incorporated into the plan. Types of businesses the public would like to see include those providing neighborhood services, providing well-paying jobs and having a limited impact on adjacent homes.

Concepts being incorporated in the plan include preserving open space, construction of 'backage' road connections behind properties, shared driveways and entrances, strong pedestrian connections and promoting multi-modal travel.

The public, especially nearby residents and property owners, are encouraged to attend the May 17 Planning Commission meeting to provide input on the plan. The meeting begins at 4:00 p.m. and will be held in the Town Administration Community Room at the bottom floor of 39 N. Ninth Street.

A COAL SHED TREASURE! If you enjoy snooping in old sheds, you just might find a treasure in Clarkdale! Councilman Bill Regner and his wife, Janet, recently purchased a house in Lower Clarkdale that still has the original coal shed, which many of them still do. He discovered what he thought might be an old music stand. He brought it to us as a donation and after a little research, we discovered it is an unabridged dictionary stand made by Giffen & Giffen in the 19th century. It made us wonder where it came from.....a library? a local school? a school in Jerome? the Reading Room in Clark Memorial Clubhouse? We do have information there was an early school in Lower Clarkdale before United Verde Copper Company built the first public school in 1914 which opened in 1916.
