These items belong in the trash can. The label might say "flushable" but disposable wipes and other products are clogging sewer pipes and damaging pumps and aerators.

JUST BECAUSE AN ITEM SAYS IT CAN BE FLUSHED DOES NOT MEAN IT SHOULD BE!

Increasingly popular bathroom wipes – pre-moistened towelettes often advertised as “flushable” – are being blamed for creating clogs and backups in septic and sewer systems around the world. While toilet paper disintegrates almost immediately after being flushed, personal wipes do not. *Unfortunately, the majority of wipes do not biodegrade (dissolve and break up) enough to avoid clogging septic or sewer system pipes.* Laboratory testing performed in a mixing chamber filled with water, showed it can still take at least 10 minutes for wipes to break down into smaller pieces.

In a septic or sewer system, wipes will combine with grease, oils, and other materials to form blockages known as fatbergs or rag balls. Over time, these build-ups will cause clogs or blockages in the sewer pipes, interrupting service or causing sewer system overflows.

Remember, it is not a case to flush or not to flush, but a case of what to flush. Please help keep your septic tanks and our sewer system healthy by being careful about what you flush down the toilet. Save yourself costly septic repairs, and save the Town costly sewer system maintenance and repairs.
