





Heritage Conservancy Board Vacancy

The Town of Clarkdale Council is seeking applications for one appointment to the Heritage Conservancy Board. The HCB consists of five representatives who regularly meet on the third Wednesday of the month.

The Heritage Conservancy Board advises the Council and staff regarding the preservation, conservation, and promotion of natural, cultural and historical resources. In addition to meetings, members accept and archive historical documents and artifacts, research records for the public and Town personnel, design displays for the library and other forums and duplicate photos, plans and other documents for the public.

Clarkdale residents interested in serving on the Board should submit an application to the Town Clerk no later than February 18, 2010. Applications are available at Town Hall, or may be printed from the Town website www.clarkdale.az.gov/forms_and_documents.

ADOT Enhancement Grants

Good News for the Town! On November 20th, the ADOT Board met and approved the list of Transportation Enhancement Grants that the State will award this year. We have received notification that both projects submitted by the Town, The Clarkdale Parkway Enhancement project and The Highway 89A Sidewalk Enhancement Project, will be funded.

The Clarkdale Parkway Enhancement project will include a pedestrian pathway along the southeast side of Clarkdale Parkway. In addition, incorporated within the pathway will be two (2) rest areas, each having a bench and trash receptacle. These areas might double as future bus stops. The pathway surface will be asphalt, which meets ADA and Town requirements. Behind the guardrail sections of Clarkdale Parkway, a "boardwalk" style walkway will be included to provide safe passage for pedestrians. Moreover, additional paving will be added along each side of Clarkdale Parkway to accommodate two-five foot bicycle lanes. The lanes will run the full distance of Clarkdale Parkway from Eleventh Street / First South intersection to the Cement Plant / Hwy 89A roundabout. This project ranked 7th in the State out of 32 applications.

The Highway 89A Sidewalk Enhancement Project, which will extend sidewalks on the east side of 89A from the Cement Plant Road Roundabout to the Lincoln/Lisa Roundabout, will meander in nature and be constructed away from the roadway where possible. It will have a five foot width, matching the existing ADOT installed walks at the roundabouts, with handrails included along sloped bank areas. Mingus Shadows Drive will receive ADA curb ramps to meet requirements along with crosswalk striping. This project ranked 9th in the State out of 23 applications.

Community Development Department

We would like to remind our citizens of the Town of Clarkdale's lighting ordinance. This was instituted to negate light pollution into our night sky, and to prevent excessive light spilling over into neighboring property.

Chapter 8 of the Town's Zoning Code further explains the purpose and intent, the approved materials and types of fixtures, along with additional information, and requirements.

Reminder– Renew Dog Licenses by January 30, 2010

TOWN CODE, SECTION 6-2-1
LICENSES AND TAGS



A. All dogs kept, harbored or maintained in the Town must be licensed and registered. Dog licenses shall be issued by the Town of Clarkdale, or by an authorized representative. License fees are established by resolution of the Council and expire on the last day of December of each year.

All dogs shall be licensed:

1. Upon the earliest age a veterinarian will administer a vaccination
2. Within 30 days of first possession;
3. Within 30 days of residence.

B. The license payment shall be deemed delinquent as of January 31st and a penalty in an amount established by resolution of the Council, shall be added to the license fee.

C. An assistance dog belonging to a person with a disability, certified by any bona fide nonprofit organization, or belonging to any bona fide nonprofit organization which is in the business of breeding, raising, or training assistance dogs, may be licensed without payment of a fee.

D.— Whenever a dog tag is lost, a duplicate tag shall be issued upon application by the owner and payment of fee in an amount established by resolution of the Council, to the Town of Clarkdale or an authorized agent.

Fees: \$ 5.00 Male Neutered, Female Spayed
\$10.00 Male/Female Unaltered
\$ 5.00 Late Charge
