Sustainable Clarkdale Update May 7, 2011

Thanks to everyone who saved 7,540 pounds of electronic waste from the landfill by recycling it at our first Sustainability in Our Backyard event on May 7th. Over 25 contributors came to share new ideas for ways we can each be more sustainable, including our first Solar Ambassador Karen Daniels who had a thorough and thought-provoking display of all the ways in which she and her husband designed and built their home with sustainability in mind. Lew Dodendorf and his team member Clark from Salt River Materials Group displayed everything one needs to know about the Energy Star program. They even had working Stirling engines and a pedal-machine for generating human powered lighting so we could see how much harder we needed to pedal to light an incandescent bulb versus the new compact fluorescent bulbs. APS brought their renewables rig with all sorts of fun things to give away and the rig powered a stage loaned to us and delivered by TAZCO Towing & Transport. Steve Estes regaled the crowd with his singing and guitar-playing, and several other presenters gave talks about sustainability topics. Special thanks go out to the town staff who volunteered and to the police department and fire district folks for cooking out and feeding somewhere between 300-500 attendees.

Community Development Department Town Code of the Town of Clarkdale Section 10-4 Fireworks Regulations States:

Consumer Fireworks authorized for sale under state law may not be sold to any person under the age of 16.

THE USE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE TOWN OF CLARKDALE IS PROHIBITED

NOTICE: Failure to Comply with this Ordinance is a Civil Offense.
Punishable by a minimum fine of \$50.00, and a maximum fine of \$250.00.

Second Violation Class 2 Misdemeanor—Fine of up to \$750.00 and up to 2 years probation.

Per Town Code section 10-4-1, A-4: Permissible Novelty items allowed in the Town of Clarkdale are:
Snappers, Snap Caps, Party Poppers, Glow Worms, Snakes, Toy Smoke Devices, and Sparklers .

CLARKDALE MAGISTRATE COURT

The Magistrate Court will frequently monitor cases for delinquent payments of fines, counseling completion, and community service work. The clerks have worked diligently to prepare cases for suspending license privileges, and then additional fees are added to the case at this time.

It is important for persons with fines due or other conditions of court orders out of the Clarkdale jurisdiction to keep in touch with the court. Keeping the court updated with current addresses and phone numbers helps the court in the monitoring process.

We are by and large in a long-term commitment to work with our defendants in all cases to resolve any issue that comes before the court with the upmost integrity and fairness to assure that our justice system works to benefit all who come in contact with the court.

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

The Community Services Department is pleased to announce the addition of "Art in Public Places" as an ongoing new program in the Clark Memorial Library. This program will bring visual arts and the community together by providing continuing exhibits of local and area artwork. "Art in Public Places" is a nationally recognized cultural arts concept that allows for art to be exhibited in a public space including publicly accessible buildings.

The inaugural exhibit featuring Grand Canyon Painter - Derry Day, opens June 1, 2011. Day has hiked over 800 miles throughout the Grand Canyon dropping deep into its interior following "ravens, ridgelines, and thunderheads" while enjoying the solitude of slipping into the Canyons cadence of wild natural rhythms, visual patterns, and shifting colors from warm to cool. Day's work will be on display June thru August during regular library hours: Monday - Thursday 8:30a-5:30p and Saturday 12:30p-4:30p. The library is closed Friday, Sunday and holidays.
